

Fire-Dependent Ecosystem Restoration on the Northwest Oregon District of the Bureau of Land Management

Timber sale environmental assessments are the most typical type of projects produced by the NW Oregon District. They may or may not include remnant oaks and pines or areas that were historically dominated by fire-dependent ecosystems. - Instructions for using eplanning.blm.gov: Select "Text Search." Under "State(s)," select "Oregon/Washington." Hold down (don't just click) the Ctrl button and select: "ORWA - Northwest Oregon DO," "ORWA - Cascades FO," "ORWA - Marys Peak FO," "ORWA - Siuslaw FO," "ORWA - Tillamook FO," and "ORWA - Upper Willamette FO." (If you only select "ORWA - Northwest Oregon DO," then you will only see a fraction of the projects on the District.) Under "Fiscal year(s)," select the current fiscal year (2018). Keep "Document Type(s)" and "Program(s)" on the default selection, "All."
