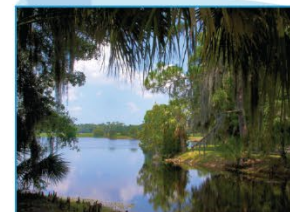

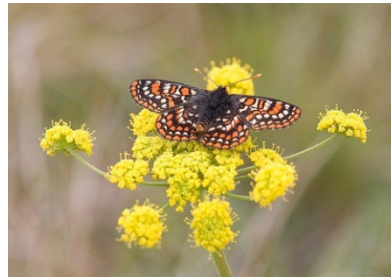


Landscape Goals and Desired Outcomes

Mazama pocket gopher

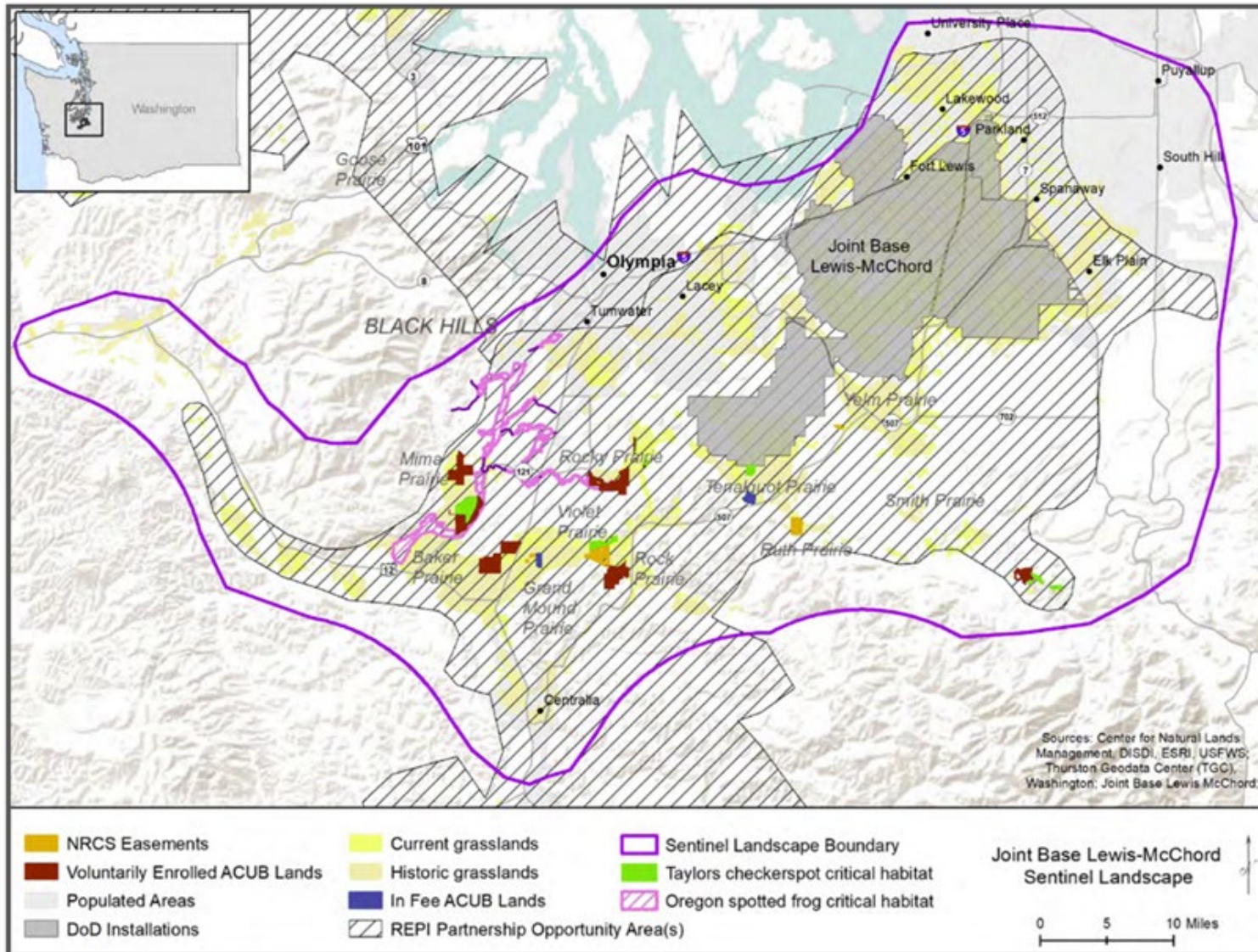


Taylor's checkerspot
butterfly

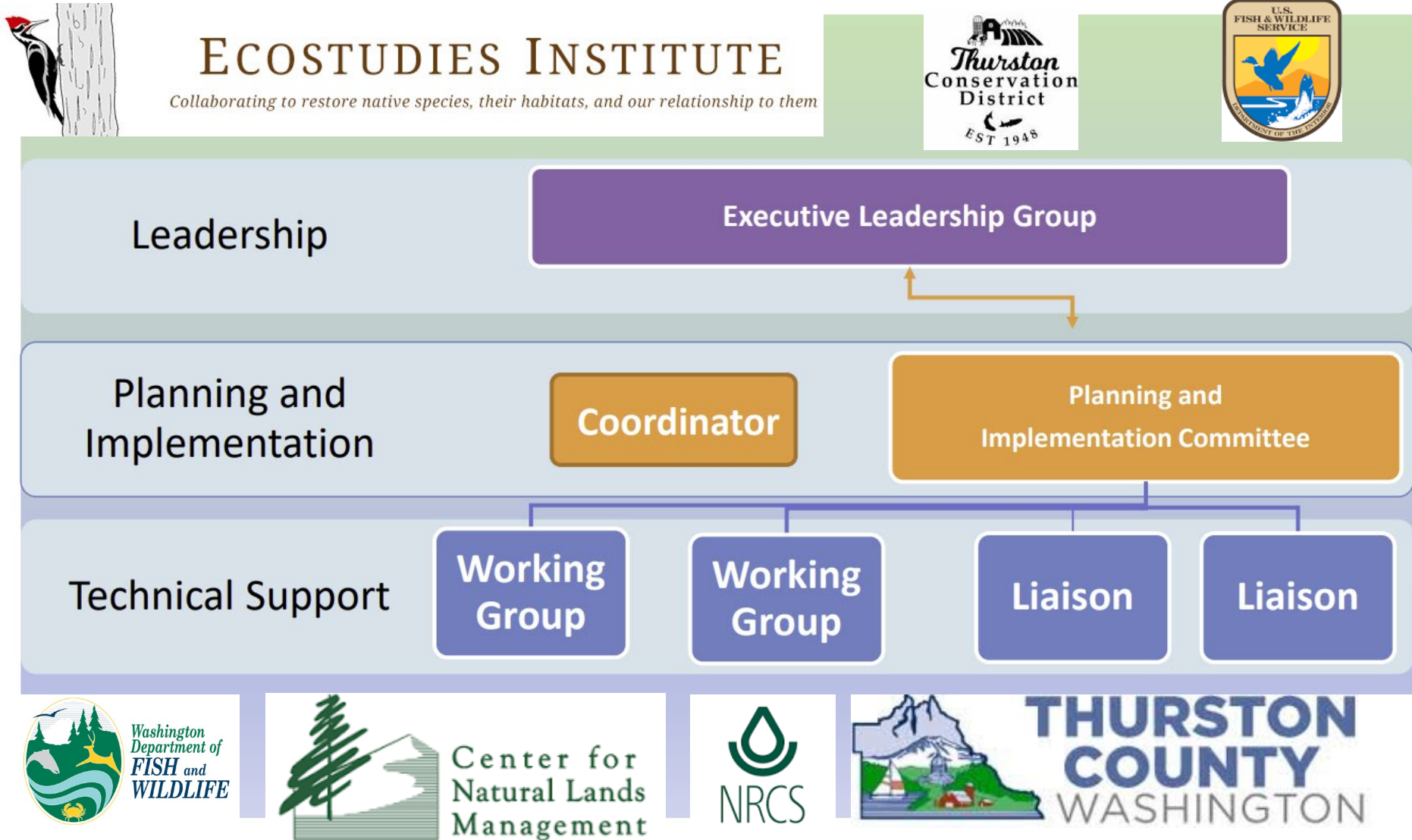


Streaked horned lark

JBLM Sentinel Landscape Footprint



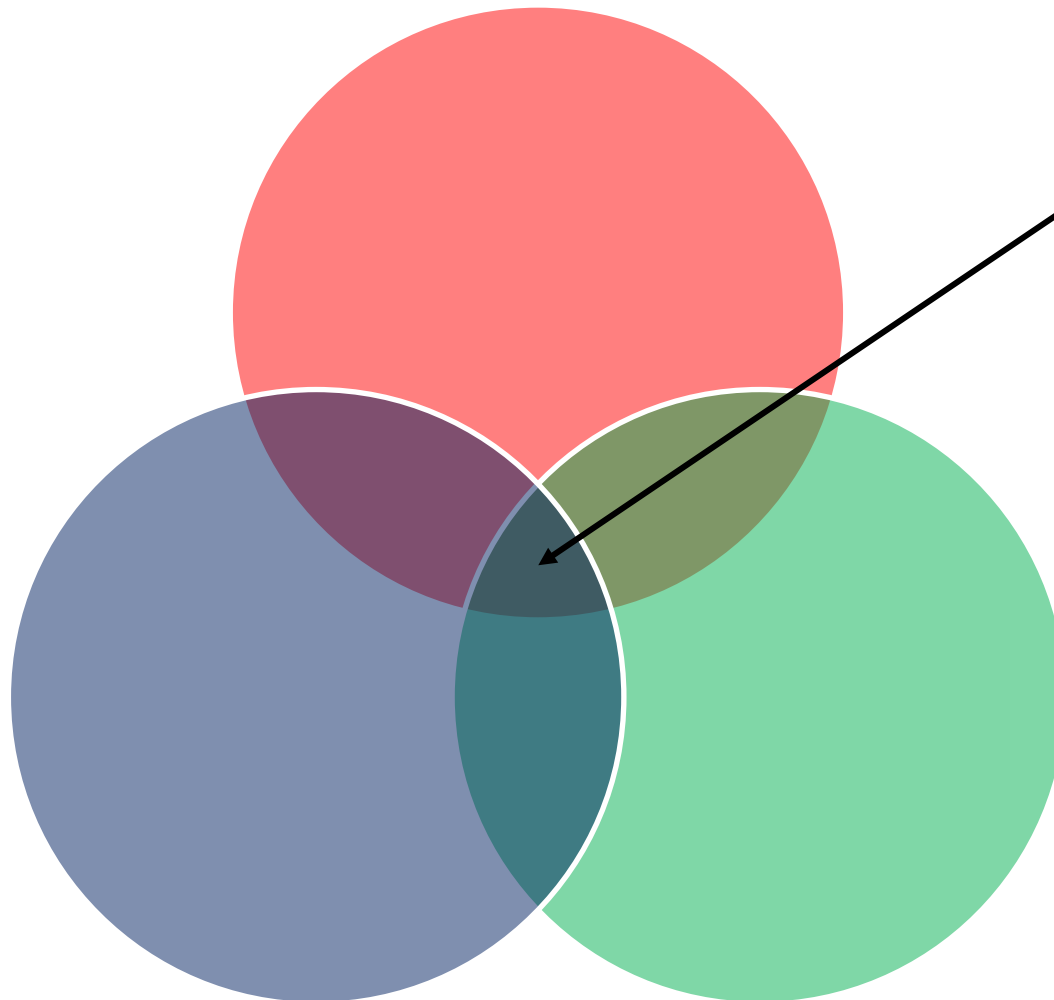
JBLM Sentinel Landscape Structure

Landscape Goals and Desired Outcomes

Military Readiness	Reduce military training restrictions on JBLM (military training currently restrained due to recently-listed species - Taylor's checkerspot, streaked horned lark, Mazama pocket gopher)
Protect	Protect prairie habitat and listed species through mitigation for training and private development, working lands efforts and other conservation actions.
Restore	Restore prairie habitat to improve status of endangered species, including establishment of new populations of listed species.
